- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the action taken by the Government to protect indigenous traditional knowledge and medical knowledge systems?

**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA
STARRED QUESTION NO. 500* FOR 7TH APRIL, 2017**

(a): India's consistent stance has been to prevent misappropriation of all forms of traditional knowledge including traditional medicinal knowledge which may subsist in codified or non-codified form and may be publicly available.

(b) &(c) No. However, the Ministry of AYUSH (the then Department of AYUSH), in collaboration with Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), has established Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL) for prevention of grant of patents on non-original inventions by International Patent offices like European Patent office, United States Patent & Trademark office, Japan Patent office etc. on Indian Systems of Medicine such as Ayurveda, Unani and Siddha.
